- > Drug abuse is common in some HIV-infected patients.
- > Heroine and cocaine.
- The use of synthetic drugs, has become popular, so that sexual practice has strengthed.

- > These drugs are known as *Chem-sex*.




- Identify the main cause of drug intoxication in HIV infected patients
- Prospective study (2014-2015) made in the ED of Hospital Clinic.
- Patients with alcohol intoxication were excluded
- Collect all patients with drug intoxication and identify HIV infected patients
- > Drug and intoxication were defiened as WGH criteria
- Chem-sex were defined as drugs to sexual practices





- > A total of 421 patients were attended in our ED
- > 56 patients were HIV. The prevalence was 13%.
- > Age 38±7,35 years. 51 (91%) were ♂.
- > 48 (86%) were under cTAR, 9 (6%) had HCV/HIC coinfection.
- > 6 (11%) were iv drug users and 11 (27%) had psychiatric patology.

Results





Eight patients required care in the resuscitation box for mechanical ventilation.

• Two patients died (5%).

Sex was the only risk factor to consume cocaine (p=0.035)





In HIV infected patients cocaine was the most consumed (52%)

> But if adding all chem-sex the percentage was bigger (61%).
